



Children must be 5 years of age by December 31 to enroll in the 24/25 ECS program.



Parking Lot Procedure

I have received feedback regarding our pick-up and drop-off procedure in our East parking lot that is just below the playground and we would like to update you on what can help improve the flow of traffic and the safety of our children.

- Parking: If you plan on parking and leaving your vehicle to come into the school, we ask that you stick to the angled parking zones. DO NOT park and leave your vehicle in the drive-through pick-up and drop-off lane. (See diagram below. Parking is marked with the green highlighted areas, and the red highlighted areas is where not to park and leave your vehicle.)
- 2) Safety: We need to up the safety of our small children in this parking lot. This is where we need the help of each of our parents. For all children in grades 4 and lower, we ask that you do one of two things. If you plan to stay in your vehicle please drive through the pick-up lane for your child to access your vehicle without having to cross and walk through the parking lot. If you park in the designated parking areas, PLEASE EXIT YOUR VEHICLE to go and collect your child from the playground to walk them safely to your vehicle. As cars back up and leave the parking lot, it is just unsafe to have our little ones crossing and walking through the parking lot. There are times when they run to their car, which has resulted in some scary moments during pick-up.


